Wishing you all a joyful and peaceful Christmas season ahead.



This term Star room have been investigating the changes in the weather. As Autumn explorations finished, winter curiosities began, and children were eager to explore the recent frost and ice.

As the class shared wintery stories, they introduced their own narratives using recall from some of last terms texts. They used their phonetical knowledge to proudly write some of the letters from their names in the snow.









As the activities continued, the children shaped snow people using peppermint dough and loose parts. They enhanced their fine motor skills by adding "sparkles" to carefully crafted icicles and filled "snow" cups using tweezers. Children investigated frozen numbers, using the warmth from their hands to melt the ice before placing the numbers into ascending order.
