Nursery - Moon Room

In Moon Room we put on our hard hats and became builders for the week. We constructed with wooden blocks, talking about which tower was taller or shorter. Using recycled boxes and PVA glue, we built houses and used loose parts such as rocks and lolly sticks with playdough to create our own structures.



We learnt about the people who work in the community and help us. The children had fun role playing as police officers and nurses, using bandages, and dressing up in hats. We sorted letters into their post boxes by numbers and colours and used spray bottles in the water tray to put out fires like firefighters.

We also had an exciting visit from two police officers who brought along their police car for us to look at. The children got to sit in the car and turn on the blue lights!



February has brought us a lot of rain which means lots of muddy puddles! We put on our coats and wellies and enjoyed squelching and jumping in the mud. The children also got creative in the mud kitchen, using the spoons and saucepans to cook up something delicious.

Nursery - Star Room

Star Room took a trip to the school library on World Book Day. The children were so excited to walk over to the main school and explore all the different books on display. They sat and looked through stories together and listened to the adults read their favourite books they had brought in from home to share with their friends.



We have been learning all about Spring – and have been so excited to spot early signs like flower buds and insects coming out. We have been practicing our painting skills by creating still-life pictures of spring flowers. We were so proud of our daffodil creations!

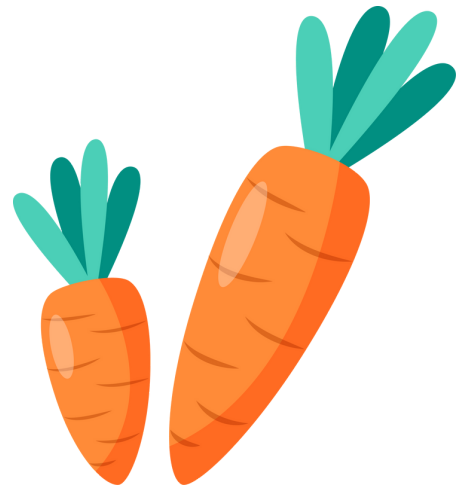

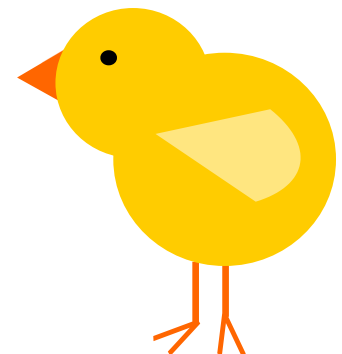
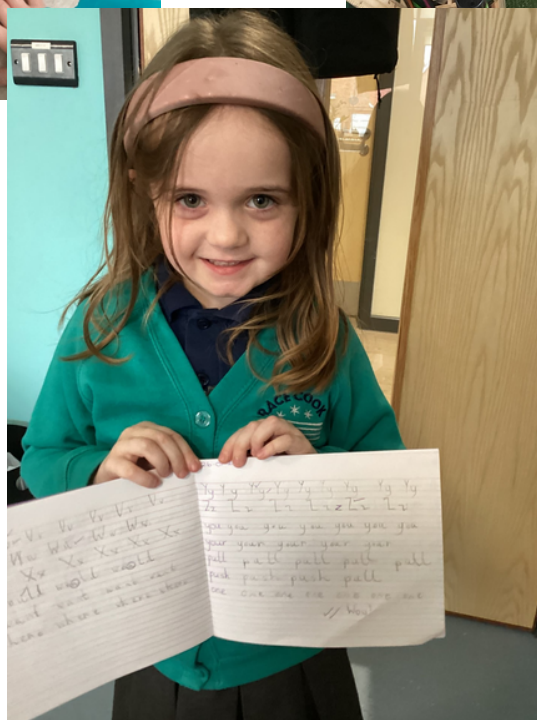
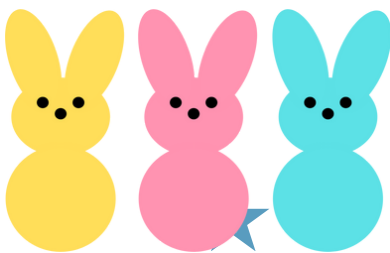
Mercury class
